President's Report- Pete Stefanisko

-Pete explained the "extra week" for Spring Break in the 2020/21 calendar. We lost school days to the fires in 2017, smoke from the Paradise fire in 2018, and 9 days of school in 2019 from fires and PG&E shutoffs. The extra week is planning ahead for any emergency days off. It is a requirement by the State of California. Members need to be aware that they should not make vacation plans for this week. It will be used as school days, if needed. Members missing these days without a doctor's note, or letter to WDEA President and WUSD Superintendent, could be docked pay on these days.

LCAP Update- Pete Stefanisko, Patti Dearth

-There was a brief discussion about the California Dashboard. In some areas, WUSD is showing improvement; in others there are difficulties. New to WUSD this year is a category for homeless students. This is because we have reached the threshold to have them count as their own population. We have also shown improvement in the area of CTE, due to being aligned to the new reporting system. The first School Board meeting in June is where the LCAP, with its budget allocations, is presented. There was a question about the Power of Being Seen, and what happens to the data. Also, concerns about how valid the data is when teachers are looking at 1700 high school students. WDEA is also still concerned about the validity of the survey questions and how much that data is being used to move the LCAP forward. MWE brought up the point that they are being told not to turn in any more SST forms because they have used up all of their resources to deal with them. Is this in line with our LCAP plan? Is it fall out from the reconfiguration? Pete will look into contract language and Ed Code.

Dues Increase Update-Pete will go to each site and meet with teachers about the Dues Increase and the Catastrophic Leave bank MOU.

Catastrophic Leave Bank MOU- The way we do our Catastrophic Leave Bank now is fairly arbitrary. In order to give more privacy and support to members, the Bargaining Team is working with the district to set up a better system. One of the

biggest changes is that you have to donate a day in order to use the bank. The new rules and requirements are listed in the MOU. The Bargaining Team will send a copy of the MOU to site reps. Site reps are requested to send questions to the team. Pete will take the final MOU to sites. We will vote on whether or not to go forward with the MOU sometime this spring. If members agree, it will start in August of 2020.

Climate Emergency Resolution- Shannan spoke about it. The general idea is for WUSD to look at ways to make our operations more environmentally sound. A copy of the resolution will be sent to site reps.

WDEA Scholarship- Marilyn will be bringing more information to our March meeting. The scholarship is for graduating seniors of WDEA members. It is \$250. The student does not need to be a WHS student, just a dependent of a member.
